What do you do with the things you love? You probably take care of them and keep them safe. That's not what Cameron Payne does. The boy from North Carolina is sharing his love of books by giving them away.

When Cameron heard about a family who lost everything in a house fire, he was looking for a way to help them. He was sad that all of their books were destroyed. That's when he created his programme, which gives books away to people in need.

Cameron's programme collects books for young people of all ages and reading levels. He collects books for kids who are blind or with low vision, too, because he wants everyone to have books. In our daily lives, we spend a lot more time typing on a keyboard than writing with pencil and pen, so does handwriting still offer anything useful?

Researchers tasked 42 adult volunteers with learning the Arabic letters from beginning: some through writing it out on paper, some through typing it out on a keyboard, and some through watching and responding to video instructions. Those in the handwriting group not only learned the unfamiliar letters more quickly, but they were also better able to apply their new knowledge to other areas—by using the letters to make new words and to recognize words they hadn't seen before, for example.

The real question is: Are there other benefits of handwriting that have to do with reading and spelling and understanding?

While writing, typing, and visual learning were effective at teaching participants to recognize Arabic letters—learners made very few mistakes after six exercise sessions—on average, the writing group needed fewer sessions to get to a good standard.

Researchers then tested the groups to see how the learning could be generalized. In every follow-up test, using skills they hadn't been trained on, the writing group performed the best: naming letters, writing letters, spelling words, and reading words.

While 42 people isn't a huge sample size for a study of this type, the trends reported by the study indicate that pen and paper still have an important role to play in learning, even as digital formats (格式) have come to control our communication. And although adults were used in this particular experiment, the researchers say their findings should have relevance to

children too. Several previous studies have also highlighted the advantages of copying as an aid to learning.

Today pupils in schools spend far less time than they used to on handwriting skills and practice, for obvious reasons—but based on what this study shows, it wouldn't be wise to put away the pens and pencils permanently. Because with writing, you're getting a stronger representation in your mind that lets you support other types of tasks that don't in any way involve handwriting.

Sometimes one plus one does equal three, as was the case when McNee, a basketball coach, met Mandekic. When Mandekic, a maths teacher, told McNee how hard it was to get students excited about maths at a gathering, he suggested, "Why not throw in something they enjoy, like sports?" "You are kidding!" Mandekic dismissed his idea at the moment.

The idea of mixing basketball and mathematics got its first shot two years later, when Mandekic and McNee, the now colleagues—who had launched a tutoring non-profit—were invited to run a summer-school programme for kids who'd failed Grade 9 maths at Vanier School.

When the students showed up for their first day, they weren't exactly thrilled. Over the next few hours, Mandekic and McNee gave the kids techniques to improve their shooting while also helping them calculate their field goal percentage—which, in turn, taught them maths knowledge. At the end of the game, the winning team was determined based on which group had the highest total percentage and had done the most efficient maths. "When the bell rang, they were so focused on collecting their data and figuring out which team won that they didn't leave," says Mandekic. The classes,

later named BallMatics, soon spread to other schools.

Later, McNee and Mandekic established a private school called Uchenna. At the school, kids with excellent basketball skills study all subjects, train for their sport and work parttime helping out with the BallMatics afterschool programmes. For the school's first graduates, the value of BallMatics is clear: all of the 16 boys landed university scholarships for their performance in the classroom, not on the court. "The school's commitment to academics is the key reason for our success. The coaches would bench students who didn't keep up in class." Abbott, one of them, says, "At Uchenna, we were student athletes, after all, not athlete students."

To develop one's taste in English, the most effective way is to read a wide variety of English books. Yet one may be at a loss to choose the right books, especially as a beginner. As a native Spanish, I would like to share some of my experience.

My first English novel was Jane Austen's Pride and Prejudice, recommended by many English teachers and professors as an ideal book for English learners. But my experience was somewhat disastrous. I had great difficulty in understanding the novel, let alone enjoying it. It was not the vocabulary that troubled me, but rather the way Austen made sentences, and her way of thinking, which seemed too hard for me at that time. My enthusiasm was much recovered after reading Hemingway's novel A Farewell to Arms. No long and complicated sentences. And I particularly liked his brief and straightforward (简单的) style. So my first suggestion is that as a beginner, you'd better choose contemporary novels instead of classical ones.

However, if you limit yourself to novels, you will miss a lot of treasures. English essays can at once inform you, entertain you, and improve your taste in English. The best

example is Bertrand Russell's work. His simple language enables his philosophy within the reach of ordinary people. Here comes my second suggestion—essays are necessary.

Never follow others' suggestions and opinions blindly, however famous or influential the person might be. We should be open to various ideas, but always think and determine by ourselves. As the saying goes, one man's meat is another man's poison. With that in mind, we are bound to find out our favourite writers through reading and develop our fine taste in English.

The days of just teaching kids their ABCs are long gone. Modern educators are tasked with the seemingly impossible responsibility of making sure that today's youth are academically (学业上) prepared for life outside the classroom and being self-aware, self-managing, socially aware, relationship-building, responsible decision-makers who are good to society. That is quite a big ask!

But social-emotional learning (SEL) answers this call and delivers on this tall order. It is a method to improve students' intrapersonal (内 心的), interpersonal, and learning ability. This process improves individual students' skills and makes for a community of successful learners willing and able to positively contribute to society. This theory truly allows individuals to develop well.

SEL has effectively predicted positive school adjustment in the school setting, increased learning engagement, minimized discipline (纪律) problems, increased high school graduation rates, and increased future employment and adult health. A main part of SEL is helping children understand their emotions. Further, not only is it important that youngsters can identify various emotions, but they must also be able to manage the emotions they experience.

Developing an identity (身份) is necessary and grown-ups, SEL satisfies requirement. By helping students develop their identity, SEL helps to increase self-confidence, identification of strengths and needs, and recognition of needs, values, and judgements.

In the classroom, SEL has been shown to positively affect students' attitudes, behaviours,

and academic performance. Further, it decreases negative behaviours, such as being off-task or behaving badly. SEL improves the learning environment and makes it a safe place for learning.

Not only is SEL significant for students' mental health, but it is also important for teachers' mental health. SEL increases teacherreported effectiveness for behaviour management and decreases reports of teachers' burnout. Ultimately, SEL creates a calmer classroom environment, which makes educating students much easier.

Dr Degenaar came into the lecture room on the first Friday morning of the term and asked us to write down our own understanding of the "soul". Here was the "teacher" asking us what we thought—it was really an exciting experience. He was not telling us what he thought but asking us how we saw something. The following discussion was interesting. That was my first experience of real learning in a classroom.

Almost 50 years have passed since that experience. Of the other lecturers who "taught" me during that year, I remember they "taught" me the history of Greek philosophy (哲学), but I remember little of that history and nothing of those lecturers. And most of what I remember about Greek philosophy is what I learned in Dr Degenaar's class, for my own interest.

I took further courses with Dr Degenaar in the following years. Like the first class, there was little "lecturing" to us, but far more involvement (参与) of us all in a process of common discovery in which we learned a lot about each other and the key points of the day. The excitement of discovery stays with me. Then it took me almost another 20 years to get a deeper understanding of what had happened in that lecture hall: experiential learning.

Traditionally, learners have been seen as "empty containers" waiting to be "filled" with learning given them by the teacher. The learner is, therefore, dependent on the teacher for what to think and how to think. Compliance

(遵从) is rewarded and so independent and original thinking is not developed.

By comparison, in experiential learning, the learner is encouraged to think for himself/herself not to repeat the thought patterns of the teacher. The learning happens not because of what a "teacher" or "lecturer" says but because of what the learner does. In this sense, I think this is the best way to learn and everyone should try it and learn from it.
