Early Chinese film history

In nearly thirty years (1905—1935) Chinese film suffered a hard **transformation** from **relying on** foreign resources to producing films **independently**.

As the first Chinese film, The Battle of Mount Dingjun was made by Ren Qingtai in 1905. It was adapted from a Peking Opera of the same title by a notable performer of Peking Opera, Tan Xinpei. The shooting of the film marked the official birth of Chinese film. Although it seemed that The Battle of Mount Dingjun was rough and ordinary, it was of great significance then. It marked the pioneering beginning to make films for Chinese people. It was the rare material not only for the history of Chinese film, but also for the history of Chinese Peking Opera.

In 1913, as the first film company set up by Chinese people, Xinmin Film Company was founded. And the first Chinese short feature film *The Couple in Hard Times* came out then.

In 1923, Star Company produced An Orphan Rescues His Grandfather and aroused a stir then. As a milestone of early Chinese film, An Orphan Rescues His Grandfather with its successful box office appealing to Chinese

Cai Chusheng drew much attention of a large audience, and it became the first Chinese film awarded the international prize in the next year. In 1935, the premiere (首映) of Children of Trouble Times was held in Shanghai, whose theme song, March of the Volunteers, was later confirmed to be the national anthem of the People's Republic of China.

When Steven Spielberg was a kid growing up in the 1950s in Arizona, watching westerns on his family's 20-inch black-and-white TV, he

would climb right up to the screen, as if to surround himself with the image. He also wished he could see these moving pictures in colour. So he searched through his family's collection of slides quickly, having learned that by holding one film or another up to the television screen, he could turn greyed-out western skies blue, or the ground to a realisticlooking green. Sometimes his mum walked in, and saw him holding these slides up to both of his eyes, right next to the TV set. Often, she would say, "You're going to burn your eves out!"

Spielberg's mum, like all the other 50s mums who said the same thing, was wrong about that. But we all know what she must have been thinking: Who is this child?

If you've seen even just one Steven Spielberg's movie in the past 50 years or so— Jaws, Schindler's List, E.T.—you have some sense of who this child grew up to be. And when you see his new film, The Fabelmans, a work of astonishing vividness that is drawn from his own family's story, you'll know even more. Movies have been around for roughly 130 years; Spielberg's career has covered more than a third of that. Yet The Fabelmans hardly feels like a late-career movie. It's a bridge for a new beginning.

Not every 75-year-old film-maker makes a movie like this. Of the ambitious young guys who remade Hollywood in the early 1970s, Spielberg is one of the few still making vital pictures at a consistent (一致的) clip. Yet his career is extraordinary in any context. He's made some box-office disappointments, but naming a badly-made Spielberg's film is hard, probably because there isn't one. No living film-maker match his devotion can

China's box office revenue during the eight-day Spring Festival holiday through Saturday exceeded 8 billion yuan, which increased by 18.47% compared with the 2023 Spring Festival holiday's box office, according to the authority.

YOLO directed by comedian Jia Ling, led the holiday revenue chart with a revenue of 2.72 billion yuan with its tale of an overweight woman regaining self-confidence through boxing, resonating widely with young audiences eager to become better versions of themselves. Although the film has caused an online controversy due to Jia's significant weight loss and muscle gain, she once explained on her Weibo account, "The film is not related to weight loss and even has very little connection with boxing. It tells how a kind person finds herself and learns to love herself."

Pegasus 2 is the second highest-grossing film so far during the holiday with a revenue of 2.398 billion yuan, followed by the movie Boonie Bears: Time Twist with 1.389 billion yuan. While Pegasus 2, with actor Shen Teng acting as a former racing car champion, won over audiences with a tale of a man's incredible victory, Boonie Bears: Time Twist intrigued many children due to the popularity of the bears and their human friend, a logger who takes on a new job as a programmer in the latest movie.

Article 20 directed by Zhang Yimou—a movie exploring the definition of justifiable defense—is in fourth position with 1.34 billion yuan.

The most notable changes include the reduction of the average ticket price, the rising enthusiasm of audiences in third- and fourth-tier cities—who accounted for over 50 percent of the entire market—and the movies' themes

being more related to the lives of ordinary Chinese people, said ZhiZhi Feina, a professor at the Chinese National Academy of Arts, adding that Chinese authorities have also tried to boost movie consumption.

Rao Shuguang, president of the China Film Critics Association, said that most of the highest-grossing movies are comedies, proving that such light-hearted tales cater to the festival atmosphere and hence appeal to many film-goers. He added that the future challenge for the domestic film industry is how to attain stable and sustainable development and encourage Chinese people to walk into cinemas regularly, not only during big holidays.

The first act of the three-act structure is typically described as being the first fourth of a story. A 120-minute film would have the first act of about 30 minutes in length. In this section, the main and supporting characters are introduced and the basic problem of the story is presented. 2. _____.

Following the plot point, the second act of a story begins, as the hero sets off to solve the problem. 3. ______; therefore, it might be the middle 60 minutes of a 120-minute film. During this act, numerous obstacles (障碍) arise to prevent the hero from solving the problem.

Lights, camera, action! Have you ever dreamed of being a director? At age 29, Di Di already has almost 10 years of directing experience under his belt. Through the media company he founded, he makes advertising and promotional videos, including for Tsinghua University.

For Di, becoming a director is "an adventure based on interest". Majoring in journalism, he got into directing by chance. "In 2013, I came up with an idea for Tsinghua's admissions video but couldn't find a director," Di said. "So I decided to be the director myself! I ended up really enjoying the process of being creative and working with a team. That was when I knew I wanted to be a director."

While many people think that directors are experts at art, Di found that directors are, in fact, experts at management. "Only one-third of my time is spent on set. The rest of the time, I'm doing lots of planning with my customers and colleagues," he said. This planning process includes working out the video's theme with the client, creating a script, bringing together the visuals and text content, and also managing logistics like where to park the cars and how to bring electricity to the set.

Despite the pressure, Di gets great joy from making an impact through his works. In 2019, he made a film for Tsinghua University, which tells the story of a group of firstgeneration college students. It was viewed more than 15 million times on social media and became a hot top 20 trending topic on Sina Weibo. Being a first-generation college student himself, Di felt very passionate about the video's goal of inspiring students to use their education to make a better life for their families. One month before the National College Entrance Examination in 2020, Di released a feature film, encouraging high school students to keep working hard after the exam was pushed back by one month.

"I want to uncover and share China's stories with the world, true stories of Chinese youth fighting for their dreams," said Di.

Lin-Manuel Miranda began writing what would become *In the Heights* as a university student. The musical play would make him a playwright and performer. Now, 20 years later, it has been made into a movie, which is in theatres for its first weekend.

Miranda said like other artists, he was not only driven by his dream but also by something else. "It was a lot of fear, honestly," Miranda said in a recent interview. "I was 18 and started to study theatre. The fear was that I was going into a domain that had no space for me and that had no roles for me. It was sort of that thing: no one was going to write your dream show."

In the Heights opened on June 10. It celebrates many things: the Latino immigrant experience, neighbourhood communities in New York City and life itself.

In order to attract young audience of the new generation and catch up with the time, the traditional opera circle makes efforts to create new works. "Innovation is good, but we must also carry on the basic elements of

jingju," another young performer Deng said.

According to Deng, innovation is perhaps the best way for jingju to deal with the problem of an aging audience. Tianleyuan Theatre has made successful attempts to combine jingju with local opera forms such as ballet when organizing performances abroad. "Innovation can help traditional arts go further. We are happy to see many young faces, and some of them even come twice to experience the 'new' art," she added.
