

Just by typing a few keywords and waiting a few seconds, a picture comparable to that painted by a human artist appears on the screen.

AI art generators have seemingly swept the Chinese Internet. In some paintings created by AI, an elderly man can be shown as a young animated image, and pets can be turned into adorable cartoon girls or boys.

Huang Ge, an illustrator from Shanghai, said that it usually takes him several hours or days to complete one illustration. But with AI art generators, the efficiency is greatly improved. "Also, the generators have many modification (修改) modes, and the picture can be modified directly in the painting software," he added. Ding Jiao, a comic artist, considers the popularity of AI art generators reasonable as many people who are not good at drawing can create great works through them.

So is the AI painting gradually replacing the human painting? In the hot topic "Using a picture to prove that human artists will never be replaced by AI" online, many netizens uploaded their

paintings to prove that humans are better than AI. "Though AI technology has developed rapidly, AI cannot fully replace humans. The warmth and inspiration in human creations are irreplaceable," said Ding Daoshi, an independent analyst.

Another controversial issue is that there is no consensus (共识) of who owns the copyright of AI art. Some users have openly sold their AI paintings and earned money, but it is still a grey area about whether the artwork belongs to users, the digital tool developers or even AI.

Ding Daoshi noted that the various sides should get together to debate the issue and come up with some accepted rules as soon as possible because AI is already penetrating deep into the lives of human beings.

A new study suggests classic paintings by well-known Impressionists Joseph Turner and Claude Monet may have been influenced by air pollution during the Industrial Revolution.

Scientists don't know exactly how polluted the cities were during that time for lack of data. However, researchers say that examining the works of Turner and Monet can give a picture of the long-term environmental change with the air pollution.

The study, published in *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences* by authors from Harvard and Sorbonne universities, analysed 60 oil paintings by Turner from 1796 to 1850 and 38 paintings by Monet from 1864 to 1901. Scientists successfully measured painters' representation (再现) of nature, focusing on the colours as well as differences in local weather patterns which influenced colouring. They significantly found that paintings created in Britain generally feature a greyer blue sky than works in other parts of Europe.

Researchers particularly believe changes in local sulfur dioxide (二氧化硫) emissions from burning coal may explain changes in the colour contrast and intensity (强度) of Turner's and Monet's works, even after taking into account the artistic trends and subject matter of the time.

Generally, artists can historically accurately represent their environment. Turner and Monet were chosen because they are famous for their landscape and cityscape paintings and also because they were active during the Industrial Revolution, when air pollution grew at a rate never seen before.

Additionally, researchers say that since the air in London was much polluted, the cities would appear grey and dull to the eyes as well as in photographs. By comparing the paintings of Turner and Monet to photos from the era, they were able to determine the painting works were definitely influenced by the change in emissions.

Her face is framed by wavy brown hair extensions, her filled lips pursed towards the viewer. It could be a description of an Instagram post, but the touched-up (修改过的) beauty is Diana Cecil, an English noblewoman who belongs to a powerful family at the Jacobean Court. Experts at English Heritage have discovered that the portrait had been altered by some restorer to enhance certain features, suggesting that our modern beauty standards might not be so modern after all.

As the great-grand-daughter of William Cecil, Lord Burghley, one of Elizabeth I's closest advisers, Diana was considered one of the great beauties of her age. Yet it seems that a later artist had other ideas. A restorer, probably in the 19th century, worked on the painting after it was damaged from being rolled sideways. It seems that the restorer also took the opportunity to alter the noblewoman's face, enlarging her lips and lowering her hairline to reduce the size of her forehead.

Now, following careful conservation work, Cecil's original appearance has been restored, with the full-length portrait painted by Cornelius Johnson when Cecil was about 31. conservation team discovered the changes made to the Johnson painting after removing a yellowing

According to Alice Tate-Harte, a conservator at English Heritage, it was not uncommon for people to "sweeten" old paintings in the 19th and early 20th centuries. "Conservation wasn't a profession. They weren't working in institutions with salaries," she said. "They were artist restorers and they had a bit more flexibility to prettify and beautify, whereas we have a lot more ethics today. We must keep our retouching to a minimum. I hope I've done Diana justice by removing those additions and presenting her natural face to the world."
