Robot nurses

[导读] 依托大数据、人工智能、5G 等核心技术,机器人应用场景日益丰富,护理机器人就是其中一例。那么,目前的护理机器人能辅助人类做哪些工作呢?

In Japan, human-like robots are already being employed as health care workers in homes for the elderly. Larger robotic machines are used to complete physical tasks such as moving patients, while smaller robots are being used to fight loneliness and inactivity in the elderly population.

Advanced robots have additional devices including touch-screens. While many elderly people prefer giving spoken commands to the robots, for those with age-related hearing loss or eye problems, having the choice to use the touch-screen is important.

It's likely that artificial intelligence will be applied in the examination and treatment of patients globally in the near future. At CES Meanwhile Moxi, a socially intelligent hospital robot developed by Diligent Robotics, has **gone into service** at three hospitals in Texas, US, as part of a pilot programme designed to **free up** nurses. "Almost 30% of our tasks are to get things," explained Phebe Lyepe, a nurse at Texas Health in Dallas, where the trial took place. "But all you need to do is press your voice button and call for Moxi." During trials, Moxi delivered things patients needed to boxes outside each patient's room and lab specimens (样本) to the lab, and carried heavy bags from patients' rooms to a cleaning area.

Moxi is being used in hospitals across the state.

A lot of scientific and technological achievements within the last 100 years were prophesied(预言) within sci-fi literature long before they came into physical existence. Throughout modern history, there has been a symbiotic (共生的) relationship between fiction and those in the science and technology fields. Pioneering science fiction synthesises (综合) and popularizes (推广) new ideas of the imagination, which in turn can lead others to establish the real-world with such ideas.

This idea highlights the notion that these so-called "fiction" writers are not just predicting the future but actually indirectly creating it.

For instance, Black Mirror: Nosedive predicted range of technological developments. It imagined a personality rating system, which is now starting to be introduced within China, as a private credit and behaviour scoring system called "Sesame(芝麻) credit". This system conducts behavioural analysis data based on the citizens' bill payments, abilities to hold contracts, shopping habits, online behaviour and characteristics of online friendships. Very low scores can affect people's real-world lives—as described in the Black Mirror, the public is restricted from making reservations at hotels or restaurants, for example.

Something as simple as providing inspiration for an idea that an inventor can actually develop shows the shaping effect the

domain can have on the world. Google Glass, self-driving cars, artificial intelligence—even human genetic modification, anti-aging processes, and space travel—are all ideas that appeared in science fiction before reality. Elon Musk's SpaceX plan of colonizing Mars is an example that we are going to see for ourselves.

Over time, history shows that science fiction is less of a predictor of the future and more of an indirect creator. With the inspiration of many aspects of our modern life based on sci-fi films, television, books, etc., the genre itself can be seen as effectively playing a part in shaping our future. Reunions offer a chance to reflect on how much has changed. One happened in Hollywood when *Here* premiered (首映), bringing together the actors, director and writer behind *Forrest Gump* 40 years later for a new film. The stars were "de-aged" using new AI tools, making them more youthful in some scenes and enabling the filmmakers to see the transformation in real time while shooting.

With the use of generative AI in film making come things worth watching. The first is how AI will be used to tell new types of stories, as storytelling becomes more personalized and interactive. No one is quite sure how the nature of storytelling will change, but it is sure to. David Thomson, a film historian, compares generative AI to the advent of sound. When movies were no longer silent, it changed the way plot points were made and how deeply viewers could connect with characters. Cristóbal Valenzuela, who runs a company providing AI-enhanced software, says AI is like a "new kind of camera", offering a fresh "opportunity to reimagine what stories are like". Both are right.

Another big development to watch is how AI will be used as a time-saving tool.

Generative AI will automate and simplify complex tasks like film-editing and special effects. For a glimpse of the future, watch *Everything Everywhere All at Once*, which won the Academy Award for Best Picture in 2023. It featured a scene that used a "rotoscoping" tool to edit out the green-screen background and make a talking rock more believable. It shortened to hours for what might have otherwise taken days of video-editing.

What is also noticeable is more dramatic conflicts between creators and those running AI platforms. This year is likely to bring floods of lawsuits (诉讼) from authors, musicians and actors about how their works have been used to train AI systems without permission or payment. Perhaps they can agree on some sort of licencing arrangement, in which AI companies start paying copyright-holders.

If shopping for an amateur chef, users can search for "great gifts for home cooks" and Google will recommend AI-powered suggestions like traditional ingredients, culinary subscriptions, or cooking classes.

There's a new virtual home try-on feature. Enter a phrase and get results from participating brands with a "try on" button. Google shows AI-generated images of models wearing the clothes. You can choose from models who resemble you based on the body type and skin colour.

Google Search and its competitors organize the web by identifying keywords on a page. Users must phrase their questions in words Google can understand. Essentially, we're shaping our thoughts for a computer. The long-term vision of AI is computers' understanding of human language, enabling users to ask questions naturally.

These new shopping tools from Google seem fun; perhaps they'll be useful, or they might just be gimmicks (噱头). Either way, they may be a preview of the future.

transformative technologies that lifted worker productivity. Does generative AI belong on that list?

Hardly a day passes without some news of the great things that so-called large language models (LLMs) can do—from writing academic papers to designing buildings—along with projections on how many jobs will be wiped out as companies figure out ways to apply the new technology. But economists are divided on whether the likes of OpenAI's ChatGPT or Google's Bard have the potential to jump-start productivity growth worldwide.

Researchers in a consulting firm project AI will deliver \$4.4 trillion in economic benefits annually to the global economy, equal to 4.4% of global output in 2022. Harvard professor Neeley likens the birth of generative AI to the arrival of the Internet. "It is exactly that moment we are facing again—that vital moment that forever changes how we work, how we interact with one another, how we think, and how we produce. We are at that moment again."

There are plenty of reasons to be sceptical, though. Robert Gordon, a professor at Northwestern University and author of *The Rise and Fall of American Growth*, argues that the Internet and AI haven't been as revolutionary as what economists call general-purpose technologies, such as electricity.

Worries about AI replacing workers have been at the centre of a labour dispute in Hollywood writers and actors. A survey by Microsoft found that $49\,\%$ of the people say they're worried AI will replace their jobs.

On the flip side, blue-collar workers could benefit. "It won't change blue-collar work, but it will change who can get out of blue-collar work and get into better jobs," an economic historian at Cornell University says. "We are living through one of those turning points in human history."
